Staff & Agency Reports:

Splash Zone Dive-In Movie-Traci Bennett briefed council on the City's first Dive-In movie, Finding Nemo, on July 15th. Movie will begin at dusk.

No council action required.

Ordinance 17-07: Amending EMC 1.22 "Civil Code Enforcement": This ordinance would allow the City to remove or destruct any hazardous conditions, i.e. overgrown yards and massive weed problems at homes that have an absent or no living owner.

Discussion ensued regarding the cost of the labor. Administrator Crago briefed that it would be likely the City would not recoup the cost of knocking down weeds that posed a fire risk.

Motion to approve and accept Ordinance 17-07: Amending EMC 1.22 "Civil Code Enforcement". (m/s Wanke/Moore) Motion Carried.

Resolution 17-966: Declaring an Emergency for Division Street Sewer Repair-IV: This Resolution retroactively authorizes the City Administrator to engage Advanced Excavation, including Eastside as asphalt sub-contractor, to repair the collapsed sewer line, declares an emergency for said collapse, and therefore waives competitive bidding requirements.

Motion to approve and accept Resolution 17-966: Declaring an Emergency for Division Street Sewer Repair-IV: (m/sMora/Knitter) Motion carried.

Award Basin Street Waterline Project: Bid opening for the Basin Street Waterline Project was Tuesday, June 27, 2017 at 11:00 a.m. Four bids were received. During the bid review process, irregularities were discovered in the bid submittals from Advantage Dirt (apparent low bidder) and DW Excavation. After review with legal counsel, those bids were rejected as non-responsive.

Scout Lake Construction of Selah, WA is the low bidder at this time. Staff and engineering have completed background checks, reviews of past work and references and recommend Council award the Basin Street Waterline Project to Scout Lake Construction.

Motion to award the bid for Basin Street Waterline Project to Scout Lake Construction. (m/s Moore/Knitter) Council discussion ensued. Motion carried.

Authorize Administration to Enter Agreement with Red Cross: Ephrata has always maintained a good working relationship with the American Red Cross. This includes an informal understanding that the ERC is one of the logical facilities for an emergency shelter. Red Cross would like to formalize this arrangement. No fee is exchanged, and no guarantee is made for the ERC's use. However, if it were needed, the existing paperwork would be ready for an emergency.

Motion to authorize administration to enter agreement with Red Cross (m/s Millard/Moore) Motion carried.

Accept Donation: The Columbia Basin Foundation has once again generously supported our B.O.L.D. program by donating \$2670.00. Director Bennett stated this is enough money to put 4 children in the program through the summer.

Motion to accept donation from the Columbia basin foundation for BOLD (m/s Knitter/Mora) motion carried.
