SEASONAL/TEMPORARY AT-WILL

0-40 Hours/Week
\$11.75-16.00/hr (18yrs+)

CLASSIFICATION ELEMENTS

Under the direction of the Maintenance Superintendent or Manager on duty. This temporary seasonal position is at-will, assists in operations of the facility with other temporary, and reports directly to the Maintenance Superintendent or Manager on duty.

GENERAL ASSIGNMENTS

1. Respond quickly, effectively and efficiently to all emergency situations per training.
2. Communicate with lifeguards and public in a professional manner.
3. Report fully all accidents/concerns involving any aspect of the facility to the Maintenance Superintendent or Manager on duty.
4. Complete incident reports in a timely manner.
5. Vacuum the pool.
6. Mow and water lawn.
7. Maintain and repair equipment
8. Complete water chemistry tests.
9. Cleaning of Splash Zone Facility.
10. Help maintain a safe environment.
11. Perform other related duties as assigned.

KNOWLEDGE, AND ABILITIES

KNOWLEDGE:

1. General safety knowledge.
2. Maintenance of equipment

ABILITY TO:

1. Interact with general public.
2. Run equipment in a safe and efficient manner.
3. Deal with staff and public in a professional, team-oriented manner.
4. Anticipate and prevent accidents.
5. Work cooperatively with others.

EDUCATION AND EXPERIENCE

1. Experience doing manual labor
2. Experience using a pool vacuum and lawnmower is highly desirable.

WORKING CONDITIONS

ENVIRONMENT:

1. Indoor and outdoor environment.
2. Working varied hours including weekends, evenings and holidays.

PHYSICAL ABILITIES:

1. Climbing.
2. Standing for extended periods of time.
3. Lifting heavy objects weighing fifty (50) pounds.
4. Walking.
5. Reaching overhead and above shoulders.
6. Kneeling or crouching.
7. Hearing and speaking to communicate information.
8. Reading and writing to communicate information.
9. Seeing to monitor activities.
10. Sensing hot and cold.
11. Smelling/sensing chlorine or chemically unbalanced water.

HAZARDS:

1. Exposure to dissatisfied or abusive individuals.
2. Exposure to heat and cold.
3. Exposure to electrical equipment.
4. Exposure to moving and sharp equipment.
5. Exposure to cleaning materials and chemicals.
6. Exposure to body fluids.
7. Exposure to distressed, non-swimming, and ill people.
8. Exposure to pool related chemicals (Chlorine, Acids).
